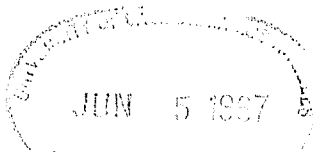

Selections were made on the basis of the applicants' interest and capabilities. Through this procedure we note that for the first time since we have been at this school the SBA is not going to be run by a small clique of personal friends of the SBA Executive Committee.
