Acknowledgments

It is with great pleasure that I present the thirteenth volume of the UCLA Historical Journal.

The articles in this issue of the Journal represent some of the most exciting work being done by history graduate students in the United States. Norbert Scholz's article on Arab nationalism provides fascinating insight into the contemporary political situation in the Middle East by examining the historical construction of a specifically Arab cultural identity. Through the use of oral history and alumni records, David Diepenbrock reconstructs life at Oberlin College for its first African-American women graduates during the painful period of Jim Crow. John Van Sant's linguistic analysis of Japan's post-World War II Constitution sheds new light on the relationship between Japan and the United States. Mary Thurlkill demonstrates how two biographers of an Irish saint changed the narrative of the saint's life over time in order to serve as a commentary on contemporary Irish political and religious debates.

My article on the exhibition of native peoples utilizes Michel Foucault's concept of the prison system as a metaphor for understanding the ways in which native peoples were represented in the United States at the turn of the century.
