I'm a painter in the theater. I paint with the light on the canvas known as theater. When I picture on the stage, everything is alive. I have the diverse size of brushes and myriad color palette. I am fascinated by light in the sense that it could not only express atmosphere and environment but also how it could illustrate many other things, even in an empty space, through color, texture, and angle.

This description above of myself as a lighting designer is what I learned from the University of California San Diego for two and a half years.
